IV. REGULAR AGENDA ITEM

 Discuss measures to prohibit bicycle riding on sidewalks in downtown Missoula (memo).— Regular Agenda (Dave Strohmaier) (Referred to committee: 07/27/09) REMOVE FROM AGENDA

Rod Austin stated that a few months ago, several people from various groups met to discuss possible solutions for the bicyclists riding on the sidewalks. There was discussion of possible enforcement of not riding bicycles on the sidewalks. It was brought up that State Law permits bicycles being ridden sidewalks but there has to be signage that designates where you can or cannot ride your bike.

Phil Smith stated this topic has been brought up several times over the past 13 years. It has never reached a resolution. Some of the issues that have been discussed are:

- 1. What is the problem that is trying to be solved? Is it the bicycle being on the sidewalk? Is it simply because it is being ridden on the sidewalk? Or is it the manner in which it is being ridden on the sidewalk?
- 2. City Code prohibits riding a bike on a sidewalk, even though State Law permits it, there are bike racks on the sidewalks, which gives the impression that riding the bikes on the sidewalks is O.K.
- 3. Is the topic being discussed the problematic behavior of all bike riders or just a few bike riders.
- 4. We don't have appropriate on-street facilities and if we did, people possibly wouldn't ride on the sidewalks.
- 5. Are we talking about only downtown or the whole city?
- 6. Law enforcement versus education?
- 7. If we would choose to prohibit bike riding on sidewalks, how do we make it happen? What resources will be used to enforce it?

Jon Wilkins asked if there are any statistics on people getting hit by bicycles. Also, how this would be funded?

Bob Jaffe stated it is a particular type of behavior . I don't really think there is anything wrong with people riding their bike on the sidewalk if they do it in a certain manner, move at the same pace as the pedestrians, have one foot down so you can stop any moment. The State Law already gives us what we need, "a person operating a bicycle upon and along a sidewalk or across a roadway shall yield the right of way to any pedestrian and shall give audible

signals before overtaking and passing any pedestrian". What I see is offensive is someone going too fast on the sidewalk. It's offensive and I think we should enforce it.

Dave Strohmaier stated that Bozeman has signage restricting bicycles on sidewalks and asked if follow up could be done with them.

Ed Childers asked what the University does to educate their pedestrians and bike riders. He also suggested a bell on the bike to notify pedestrians that the bike is approaching.

Rod Austin stated they have tried to get their Ambassadors to the University during Orientation for the purpose of educating the riders.
