Subject: Comment on the ACS and Black Knight Security

During the Wednesday meeting you all heard, once again, from the residents at ACS and care providers there on the critical nature of the ACS to the wellness of the homeless in town. Despite the mealy-mouthed nature of Heidi's points that the closure was not what was being voted on, several citizens did the right thing and pointed out that the closure was happening in tandem with the proposed motions. It's pretty aggravating to have to sit through this same inane conversation week after week, watching the council condescend to the people who do the real work of community care around here.

The sloppy nature by which the meeting was conducted, and the disregard for the public comment is yet more evidence of the ineptitude of much of the council. I've been trying to speak sense and decency to yall for months, every time you hear the public speak you ignore them, and you continue to push through slap-dash measures that you yourselves are uneducated on. If that weren't frustrating enough, you all then have the audacity to trot out transparently hollow displays of concern for the well being of our homeless neighbors. Rolling out half-baked plans at the buzzer does not indicate seriousness nor genuine concern. I said it at the budgeting meeting and I'll say it again, you do not get to use the excuse that your job is "difficult", you wanted this job. You have a responsibility to do it well, especially since you all hold actual power to improve or destroy lives. This seemingly hasn't dawned on many of you.

I've talked a bit to Wade, and he seems like he'd be a fine enough guy to get a beer with, but just like Rogers his employees have some of the same distressing lack of professionalism I warned the council about back in the Spring. Just as I've said before, the type of guys who wanna get paid Burger King wages to hang out armed at homeless camps are not the guys whose judgment I'd trust. I know Stacie and similarly inclined white liberals love the idea of armed guards on every street corner, but the data from the council's own deeply flawed "survey" shows that this by no means makes communities safer, nor even simply feel safer.

I've stopped attending council meetings for the sake of my own blood pressure and the Matthew 7:6 doctrine, but each of you should take some time to figure out why it is that the majority of people who make sacrifices to come and give comment in the middle of the work day are there to beg you all to change course and practice some basic humanity. Leaders should be capable of introspection and honest self-assessment, and it is inarguable that any real assessment of the centrist councilors' performances on the issues of homelessness in this community are catastrophically inadequate.
