Dear Council Members,

My name is Adam Boomer SWLC and psychedelic therapist here in Missoula. I work with Harvest Wholeness doing Ketamine therapy for clients with PTSD, Anxiety and depression. Currently, Ketamine is the only legal medicine on this space. We are seeing significant reduction of symptoms and return to a higher standard of life.

However, due to new research from John Hopkins on Psilocybin/ magic mushrooms and new the book *How To Change Your Mind* by Micheal Pollen. <https://www.hopkinsmedicine.org/news/newsroom/news-releases/psilocybin-treatment-for-major-depression-effective-for-up-to-a-year-for-most-patients-study-shows> Many people in our community are using these medicines to improve their life's on their own. I don't believe that my clients that cannot afford the treatments that I offer should risk jail time for healing themselves.

I have seen suicidal clients go from wanting to die to thriving. Now these medicines are very powerful and need to be respected for their healing qualities. They can most certainly be miss used and people can harm themselves. I work with many clients doing harm reduction. By decriminalizing these medicines clients can access safe medicine and not fear being put in a cage.

I wanted to open my door to you all and share the many stories of healing in our community. Many of you may know that Oregon has made a legal framework for these medicines to be used by therapists by 2023. There are many reasons to decriminalize these medicines and I would like the opportunity to share the stories of our community.

Daniel,

I'm going to loop in the City administration, CPDI housing folks, and Leigh Griffing on this referral because we don't have sufficient information for a Council committee to consider amending the budget. Amending the City's budget requires a resolution that includes the dollar amount to be appropriated—the funds/revenue codes associated with the source of funds for the program and the budget codes where the money will be appropriated to. The procedure to amend the City's budget requires published notice in the newspaper for 2 successive weeks with 6 days separating each publication, and a public hearing. Here is the statute on the procedure to amend the City budget:

7-6-4021. Notice of preliminary or amended budget. (1) The governing body shall cause a notice of a public hearing on the preliminary or amended budget to be published. The notice must:

- (a) provide that the governing body has completed its preliminary annual budget for the ensuing fiscal year or intends to amend its annual budget;
- (b) state that the budget or budget amendment has been placed on file and is open to inspection in the county or municipal office designated in the notice;
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- (d) state that any taxpayer or resident may appear at the meeting and be heard for or against any part of the proposed budget or budget amendment.

(2) The publication requirements must conform to the provisions of **7-1-2121** for a county or **7-1-4127** for a municipality.
