The City of Missoula's Street Maintenance crews will begin their annual chip and seal street maintenance work on Monday, July 17, with completion expected the week of August 7. Crews will apply a layer of liquid asphalt followed by a layer of rock chips to certain streets in order to seal the surface, protecting it from weather conditions and extending its life.
